

We again ran our Miniroos Kick Off program for 3-5 year olds and had many enrolments. The program ran for 10 weeks and budding new stars got their first introduction to our great game early on Saturday mornings. Thanks to all club members who made this such a resounding success.

Our Miniroos in the Under 5 to Under 7's had a fantastic time this year and lots of smiles were seen around Potter Field as these teams learn the game under their dedicated coaches. They were given great support from their enthusiastic parents and it was great to see them having fun.

Our Under 8 teams moved onto the bigger fields this year as did our Under 10's. They adjusted well to the changes and played some great football. All of our teams in the U8 to Under 11 age groups improved under their coaches and were a credit to their coaches and the club. It was great to watch them play and see them enjoy the game so much.

I also had the great pleasure of attending Gala days featuring our U7, U8 and U9 teams this year. The skills of these young players and the dedication of their coaches was a treat and they represented the club in all the right ways and were a credit to us.

In the junior competition age groups all teams performed well and gave 100% every game. All teams improved throughout the season but in particular our U13 boys coached by Phil Allen played some outstanding football in the back end of the season. Our U12's had a difficult start to the year but improved as the year went on and they played with great spirit. Next year promises more. Our U13 girls had a fine season placing in the top four and are a team to keep an eye on in the next couple of years.

Our U15's were in Division 1 and were highly competitive all year. They were unlucky to be on the wrong end of the result in some close games but with a little more luck next year will be their year. Our U16 team played some fine football under Walter and qualified for the semi finals where they were unlucky to lose to Warradale in extra time. These young guys are the future of our club.

Our seniors flew the flag for the club this year in competition football. All five teams made the semi finals with four going on to make the Grand Final. St Marys FC was the most represented club on senior grand final day.

Our new Ladies team did the club proud and finished second after the home and away rounds which is a great achievement. They agonisingly lost a penalty shoot out in the semi denying them a deserved spot in the GF. They have great team spirit and will be hard to beat next year.

We were fortunate to have two all St Marys grand finals this year at Jamison Park with our AA7 & AA9 teams dominating their leages this year. Both games were classics with plenty of goals and in the end went to extra time. In the AA7, St Marys White got the chocolates with a last minute penalty and were worthy winners after being runners up last season. The Black team also had a fantastic year and were a credit to the club as they always have been.

The AA9 game was a pulsating affair in front of a large crowd with a couple of stunning goals and after 90 mins and extra time the teams could not be separated. The game went to the dreaded penalty shootout with St Marys Black prevailing over the Whites who had claimed the minor premiership. Both teams had great years and a share of the spoils was reward for both teams who had excellent seasons.

Off the field the club remains in a strong position with playing numbers steady and our financial position remains strong. Healthy sponsorships and the canteen being open again have helped the bottom line and hopefully the club will remain fiscally sound in the years to come.

As for me my time as President is up and I leave the club with it in far better shape than when I assumed the role 4 seasons ago. At that time the club was floundering, losing numbers and with ever diminishing numbers of teams. Morale was low and the club was still operating as it had 25 years previously.

Together with innovative committee members such as Rebecca Borg, Brad Taylor, Jasmin Hodge, Kevin Zoutendijk and Daniel and Aiden Branik we dragged the club into the 21st century, utilising the all the technology to make the club better and operate more effectively. One of my proudest achievements of my term was the introduction of the new logo, reflecting our future, football for everyone of both sexes.

Two seasons of Covid 19 and a season of floods were the most challenging years community sports in NSW had ever faced. But the changes we made allowed the club to absorb these hurdles. Our club was a leader in the Association when it came to Covid controls and many of the changes we made to the running of the club have been adopted by other clubs within Nepean.





We had a total of 268 registered players at our club for 2023 compared to 265 last year — having lost some juniors and gained senior players.


