

As we wrap up the 2024 soccer season, it's clear that this year has been marked by significant achievements and challenges for St Marys Football Club.

Weather Challenges: The wet weather has once again played havoc with our season, presenting ongoing challenges. Despite this, the club has shown remarkable resilience and adaptability.

Club Growth: We are pleased to report a substantial increase in club participation this year. Overall registered players have risen by 57%, reaching a total of 422. Notably, female registrations have surged by 149%, totalling 127, while male registrations have increased by 34%, bringing the total to 291. This growth reflects our successful efforts to engage and support players across all demographics.

Team Participation: Our club's expansion is also evident in the rise in team participation, which has grown by 68% to 32 teams. This increase demonstrates our club's growing appeal and the effectiveness of our community outreach.

MKO and Miniroo 3-5 years old & u5-u11: This season has been truly exceptional for our Grass roots Programs, as we've witnessed remarkable growth and enthusiasm among our young players. With a huge number of participants joining club, our fields have been bustling with the energy and excitement of children discovering, developing, and excelling in the joy of soccer. The increase in registrations reflects not only the program's appeal but also the positive impact of our dedicated coaches and engaging sessions and games. Families have shared glowing feedback about their children's improved skills, confidence, and enjoyment, underscoring the success of our age-appropriate training and supportive environment and importance of grass roots programs. Our goal of running our mini roo kick off program and our grass roots community-based football is to lay a strong foundation for the future, demonstrating our commitment to nurturing a love for soccer from an early age and building a vibrant community around our club. **Competition teams u12-u16:** This season has been thrilling for our U12 to U16 competition teams, with each match bringing excitement and exceptional performances. Our players have shown incredible skill, determination, and teamwork, resulting in a series of captivating games and impressive results. The competition has been fierce, but our teams have risen to the challenge, demonstrating both sportsmanship and talent. The enthusiasm and dedication of our young athletes have made this season one to remember, highlighting the strength and potential of our future stars.

On-Field Success: This season has been a triumph on the field, highlighted by our AAW4 team's outstanding performance as Minor Premiers. We also enjoyed a successful final series, with six teams reaching the Grand Finals. Of these, five teams emerged victorious:

2. Community to Save a Life: The Local Sport Defibrillator Program grant provided us with an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) package. This vital equipment enhances safety at our facilities, offering peace of mind and potentially saving lives in emergency situations.



A phenomenal result considering that they are still only a relatively new team, being only their second season together. Add to that, the Division 5 team, against all odds, clawed their way up from 6th position on the ladder, to knocking out the undefeated Minor Premiers with back to back victories in the Championship Rounds, to then being Finals Winners! Honestly I could not of even imagined this outcome. I true story of the rising of the underdogs.

Female Football

With the recent hype around the Women's World Cup and the "Matilda Effect" taking hold, we as a club took to task at making as many playing opportunities available as possible for women & girls who want to play our beautiful sport. 2024 saw us as a club really put in a concerted effort in growing our female only teams. This season saw us field 4 Junior all girls teams (U11, U12, U14 & U15) & 2 All Age Women's teams. That is an astounding 300% increase in female teams from the 2023 season, and whilst there have been some challenges that come along with such an accelerated amount of growth, I personally had the privilege of not only coaching one of these teams, but also witnessing many amazing young ladies playing their first ever season of football. I must say I am super excited that girls are getting involved with the greatest sport in the world & I love nothing more than watching them get enjoyment from playing, growing in confidence & improving every single week.

Hopefully this is the start to many more girls enjoying our sport and the growth of all girls' teams at our club.

Fundraising & Sponsorships

SMFC have always prided ourselves on being a family friendly, member centric club, with a focus on keeping our great sport affordable and accessible to all. With these key principals in mind, we have always stived to keep our registration fees as low as possible. What most members don't know is that we as a club do not actually make any revenue from registrations. Our registration fees are made up of the Football NSW & Nepean Football Association fees, Insurance & match fees to pay for game day officials. All other operational costs like, field hire, lighting, electricity, equipment, field marking equipment & paint, playing strips, presentations (trophies, events) etc, all need to be funded from other sources. This means that we have to maintain other ways to generate income to keep our club viable and in a good financial position.

Grants







Fields & Game Day


